The department of Social Work in collaboration with Montfort Social Institute (MSI) organized "International Domestic Workers day" celebration on 19<sup>th</sup> June 2019 at Maris Stella College with nearly 250 domestic workers. .Mr. Malladi Vishnu, MLA Vijayawada central was the guest of honor and his valuable presence made the day very special. The other guests include Br. Varghese, Director of Montfort Social Institute, Sr. JasinthaQuadres, Principal of Maris Stella College, Mrs. A. Seethamma, President of trade union, Sr. Lovely Jacob, former Head of the Department of Social Work and Mr. Ramesh, the city coordinator of Child line, Vijayawada .



The programme began with beautiful prayer dance by the students . After which Sr.Kumari the coordinator of the programme invited the guests. Sr. Jasintha addressed the gathering by inviting guests and domestic workers to Maris Stella College for this occasion. Br. Varghese after his speech submitted a Memorandum to Mr. Malladi Vishnu, the MLA in request of an act on demands and rights of the domestic workers. Mrs. A. Seetama. President of trade union gave a brief speech on the need for protecting the rights of the domestic works. The "E" T.V. channel interviewed the MLA.

Mr. Srinivas Rao and Mr.Govinthuthe labour officers delivered a speech about the benefits of Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Mandhan scheme. #### VISIT TO CHIGURU

CHIGURU, is the NavajeevanBalaBhavans' project for the children within the age groups of 5-12 years. CHIGURU is located on the Banks of River Krishna. This year due to the heavy rains and floods in River Krishna all the children's village was full of Water. Children were all taken to safety zone before the water coming onto the banks .Social work students visited the Chiguru, a Children's village in VenkataPalem. It is residential home for the children of divorced parents, broken families, orphans, street children, rescued children. The vision of the home is " A child friendly society where all children enjoy their right. This is centre is the branch of NavajeevanBalBhavancentre. It is home for the street children run by Don Bosco fathers. It has a residential bridge school for children and here children prepared to join the regular classes. They live in a small cottage in different groups. Group care homes one of the alterative forms of care with the view to give more individual attention. It also accommodates short stay home for girl children above 15 years and young women victims of sexual, physical and other forms of violence..

They are given opportunity to have in-depth counseling, livelihood advancement skills training, life skills cum sexual health education etc.

It was very inspiring to see the valuable service done for these deserving children.

#### INTERFACE MEETING WITH YOUTH ADVOCATES AND GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVE

The workshop on Youth Voice was organized by Mahita Plan International in collaboration with Child LIne on 6<sup>th</sup> July at Child line office at Hanumanpet. The theme of the workshop is on "Child Marriages and Child Trafficking"

#### **Objectives:**

- To create awareness about gender related issues and various legal provisions.
- To discuss about the various causes of gender discrimination
- To bring the issue into the notice of the government through social media

Mr.GodaePrasad , the state coordinator of Mahita Plan International conducted the programme. He invited the speakers to give their view on the two issues Child Marriages and Child Trafficking. Mr.Krishna Kumar the member of Child Welfare Commission said that their commission gives recommendations and monitors the functioning of the Child Welfare Committees. Raman the President of NerhuruYuvaKendara spoke about the various youth clubs formed in villages of Rajasthan to create awareness on Child Marriages. Mr.Vijay Kumar, The district Child Protection Officer explained about the different types of Child rights. At the end there was open discussion in which the socialwork students actively participated.

The motto of the institute is to provide a model programme for children with special needs in participation of their parents and families with specially developed , innovative practices and multidisciplinary , therapeutic interventions. Mrs. Jansi along with staff explained about the vision and mission of the NGO. The Vision of the NGO - To empower and equip families of people with intellectual and development disabilities with information and knowledge to support their children in achieving their true potential. Students visited the NGO and interacted with the children.

#### **DOSTHI WEEK CELEBRATION- 19.11.2019**


The sensitization programme for railway employees

The third year social work students visited the Montfort Social Institute (MSI) which addresses three important issues of our times – protection of human rights, sustainable development, and governance. The coordinator explained that the institution works for domestic workers, human rights and provided supplementary education to the poor students in the slum. They work nearly in 20 slums. They do offer training for the domestic workers in preparation of skin care items, cleaning solutions for income generation.

Human rights can best be explained by the fact that all human beings are born free and equal in rights and that they are endowed with a spirit of brotherhood and sisterhood but while we are advancing in technology, human beings are bought and sold as commodities which is human trafficking. Human trafficking is the world's 2nd largest organized crime where children and women are enslaved daily.

So Maris Stella College in collaboration with International Justice Mission has chosen this day to launch the First ever Anti Human Trafficking Club in Andhra Pradesh, to prepare young minds to end human slavery in our society.
