2. Promotions

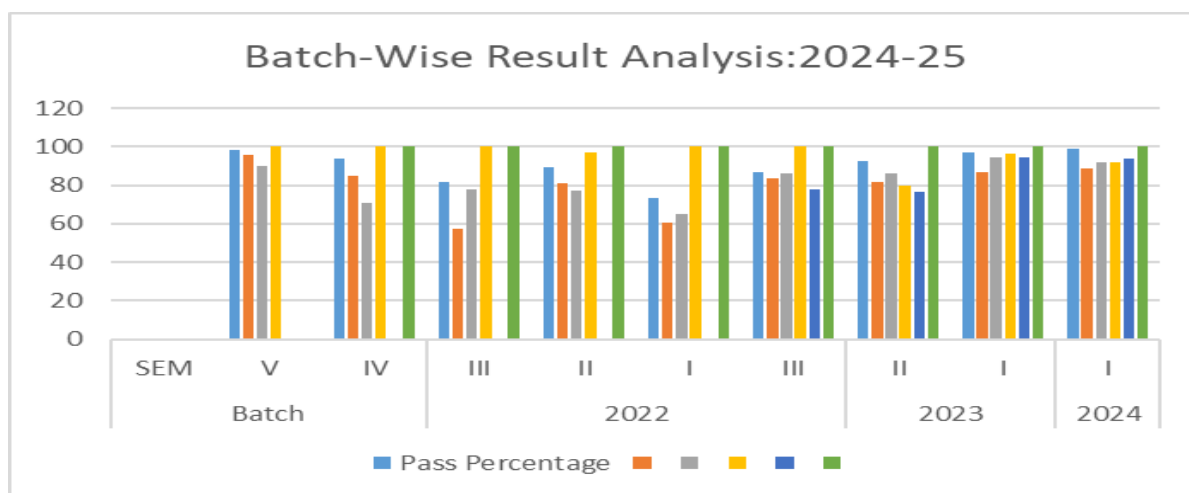
Ms. K. V. L. Prasuna has been promoted as Office Superintendent and Mr. A. Ravi Chandra as Junior Assistant.

4. Infrastructure

To improve student involvement and support services, the college built a ‘Lounge’ to provide a comfortable place for relaxation, peer interaction and collaborative learning and ‘Information Corner’ which offers access to academic, administrative and career-related resources. 35 laptops, a high-end workstation, a multipurpose photo copier, a professional mirrorless camera, five interactive panels, and a UV-visible spectrophotometer have been added to the labs and IT infrastructure to improve learning and event documentation. - A workshop was conducted on International Yoga Day, 21 June 2024 to promote wellness, and the units organized a Peace Rally focusing on women's safety and security.
- The Swachhata Pakhwada programme and medical and eye camps were conducted on 13 Sept. 2024.
- This year, the NSS volunteers and coordinators went above and beyond by providing exceptional services during the recent floods in Vijayawada. They actively participated in flood relief emergency services in Singh Nagar, Payakapuram, and Bhavanipuram - alongside the Indian Red Cross Society. Their efforts also included food packing for flood victims, offering critical support during a time of crisis.
- Beyond flood relief, the NSS units observed NSS Day, 24 Sept. 2024 organized an AIDS Awareness Rally, and rendered valuable services during the Nava Raatrulu celebrations 3-12 Oct. 2024 of the Dasara festival.
